

## **Making Re-connections**

Several weeks ago, I was volunteering for a charitable event at a local Savannah, Georgia minor league hockey game. A friend of mine oversees the regional part of an organization that donates stuffed toy animals to children in local hospitals. The national organization is called Hugaroo.

The spectators have brought gifts (stuffed toy animals) and during the game when the home team scores their first goal, everyone throws their gift on to the ice. Obviously, they stop the game and collect the hundreds, maybe thousands, of toys as quickly as possible. And then the game continues.

To avoid having the toys get too wet or soggy from being on the ice, the Hugaroo organization offers everyone a 2 -gallon resealable plastic bag. Several other volunteers and I greeted the spectators as they entered the arena and gave people these bags, so they could put their gift toys into the plastic bags before they throw them on the ice.

Since I arrived early for the event, I asked a security guard which entrance I should use to meet the charitable group. Participation with Hugaroo included a free pass to enter the arena and see the game later. He only knew

of a special group at the far-right entrance to the building that were getting passes that evening. I walked over there and asked. The only persons at that entrance were another security guard and a lady, who was in charge of a different charitable group. Her group had a special event planned that included a pre-paid ticket, meal, drinks, t-shirts, and a meet-and-greet with players and the team mascot. Obviously not my group.

But as I talked with the lady in charge, explaining my purpose of being there, something about her caught my eye and her voice sounded familiar. And by chance, someone in her group called her by her first name – Kathleen. I have an aunt by that name, but that was not the connection. Then it dawned on me.

So I asked her - "Are you Kathleen Deloach"?

### Be Poised for Change

- 3. Lead by example: As a leader, model the behaviors and mindsets you want to see in your organization. Be consistent in your actions and communication to establish trust and credibility with your team.
- 4. Encourage open communication: Create a culture of open communication, where employees feel comfortable expressing their opinions and ideas. This will help identify opportunities for growth and improvement.
- 5. Celebrate successes: Celebrate when team members demonstrate the desired change and acknowledge their contributions. This will motivate others to implement the new change as well.

In the words of NMA founder, Charles F. Kettering, "The world hates change, yet it is the only thing that has brought progress."

In conclusion, the new norm requires leaders to have a different skill set compared to pre-COVID times. They need to be agile, empathetic, tech-savvy, and safety-focused while fostering innovation, collaboration, and clear communication.

I met up with Kathleen later that evening and we caught up on many things since we had not been in contact for so long. It turns out, she

is now Doctor Kathleen DeLoach Benton, the President and CEO of the Hospice Savannah center. She was there to reward her volunteers and staff with an evening of entertainment. We talked briefly about her 3 kids, her college, and how her winnings from the speech contest helped pay for part of college. I talked a bit (yeah right, just a little) about my retirement and how I volunteer at my local elementary schools and the local Bluffton, South Carolina Boy's and Girl's Club.

It made me feel very glad to see one of "our NMA kids" again and the success she has become.

Seeing former contestants was not too unusual in the years immediately following any contest. Many of these students kept in touch through college and beyond for a few years. Several of them even came back to volunteer and helped on committees for the contest. One year, a former winning contestant even became the emcee of our local speech contest, as she was majoring in media and journalism.

I wonder if social media, Facebook, and other similar apps would provide info about former contestants or would that be considered too much of an invasion of privacy.

Anyway, it would be very interesting to find out more about other past speech contestants and other NMA student supported activities, just to find out where and what these students are doing today.



I plan to do a follow-up with Kathleen and her family when we meet for dinner. More info to come.

When I told this incredible re-connection story about Kathleen to a current friend of mine, she thinks she knows another student from one of our local past NMA contests. So, another re-connection might be made. I'll keep you posted on that one too

In any case, based on this recent re-connection, I know our volunteer efforts have had a meaningful outcome.


